Working to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 2030

The Paris Agreement is a new international framework which went into effect in November 2016 which addresses the issue of greenhouse reduction from 2020 onward. As a member of the Electric Power Council for a Low Carbon Society (established in February 2016), Kyushu Electric Power is committed to finding ways to steadily reduce greenhouse gas emissions on both the supply and demand sides in order to meet the 2030 targets set for the electric power industry and Japan as a whole.

Specifically, given the fact that nuclear energy represents an excellent power source in terms of energy security, economic efficiency and global warming prevention, we have made maintaining stable operation of reactors #1 and #2 at the Sendai Nuclear Power Plant, as well as the safe and expedited restarting of reactors #3 and #4 at the Genkai Nuclear Power Plant, our major priorities.

With regard to thermal power generation, we are working to maintain and improve power generating efficiency from the standpoint of controlling CO₂ emissions, and in June 2016 we began operation of Shin-Oita Power Plant No.3×4, which has a generating efficiency among the best in the world. As for renewable energy, we are pursuing a balanced suite of facilities and measures, including launching the Buzen Accumulator Substation in March 2016 which is equipped with an accumulation system rivaling the best in the world, that will maximize the degree to which we incorporate renewable energy into our operations.

Working with local communities on robust environmental action

In May 2016, Kyushu Electric Power established the Kyuden Mirai Foundation to carry out "Environmental Activities" and "Future Generations Development Support Activities" tailored to the expectations of the local community and in service of further enriching our community-based outreach and problem-solving contributions. This Foundation works together with long-standing community groups and members to carry out environmental preservation activities in the Ramsar Convention-registered Kuju Bogatsuru Marshlands of Oita Prefecture, to enhance the watershed protection forest-based environmental educational activities conducted by Kyushu Electric Power, and to provide support to community-based activities aimed at cultivating the next generation. Further, the Foundation is involved in a variety of environmental education activities throughout Kyushu that cultivate environmental-mindedness amongst future generations, such as the "Play Forest" experience, which takes children into the forest to "learn," "protect" and "enjoy" nature.
