Community efforts

Working as part of the regional community, Kyushu Electric Power helps make Kyushu a better place to live by participating in cultural, volunteer and sports activities.

Cultural activities

We sponsor concerts, essay contests, festivals, folk performances and traditional crafts.

Volunteer work

Our offices arrange visits to social welfare facilities and help the community when needed. During Friendship Week and Environment Month they organize cleanups and checks of electrical wiring in homes and offices. Kyushu Electric Power is also active during Volunteer Month and supports the individual volunteer activities of employees.

Sports

Our offices sponsor local sporting events and instructional programs by professional athletes.

Promoting regional development

Kyushu Electric Power is committed to close cooperation with the region. Working with the Japanese government, regional authorities and related organizations, we contribute to Kyushu's development in many ways.

Helping local industries

- Together with local industry promotion centers, we hold symposiums and trade fairs to cultivate local industries.
- Together with local authorities, we cosponsor symposiums on community development.
- We sponsor several programs to keep traditional crafts alive. One program sends young craftspeople throughout Japan and abroad for training.

Attracting companies to the region

- To advertise Kyushu's potential for industry, we have published a guidebook on the best plant locations in Kyushu.
- Together with local authorities, we hold seminars for companies considering establishing bases in Kyushu. We also compile data to attract companies to the region.

Creating infrastructure

- Kyushu Electric Power is an active member of several regional development committees sponsored by the Japanese government and local authorities.
